I am pleased to say that our book exchange continues to be held at the Parish

The Parish Council aims are to support and improve the quality of life for the whole Parish of Locking. Councillors are community leaders who care about the local residents they represent, to bring about the best outcomes for all parts of the community.

Locking Parish Council Small Grant Scheme

Locking Parish Council's annual budget includes a sum of money for grant awards.

The **Grant Awards Policy** has been drawn up to demonstrate a fair and transparent process and sets out the procedure the Council will follow when making its decision.

A grant is any payment made by the Council to an organisation for a specific purpose that will benefit the Parish, or residents of the Parish; and which is not directly controlled or administered by the Council.

Any organisation wishing to apply for grant funding must fill in a **grant application form** and submit it to the Clerk.

The Council awards grants, at its discretion, to organisations which can demonstrate a clear need for financial support to achieve an objective which will benefit the Parish by:

- Providing a service
- Enhancing the quality of life
- Improving recreation and/or sports
- Improving the environment
- Promoting the Locking Parish in a positive way

Locking Parish Council will not normally make grants to organisations outside of the Parish unless there are direct benefits to the Parish, or its residents. Applications should be made for 'one-off grants' that will not result in any recurring expenditure for the Parish Council.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) Community Grants Programme Grant Award for Locking Parish Hall

Locking Parish Council using a generous grant of £20,000. from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) Community Grants Programme, supported by North Somerset Council has completed the renovations/refurbishment to the old GP rooms adjacent to Locking Parish Hall.

The current layout of the GP Rooms, with its separate waiting room, GP office, and receptionists' office, had become obsolete and did not meet the needs of the growing community. The refurbishment eliminated these outdated partitions and has created a self-contained facility with a large, open, and adaptable space with a convenient kitchenette and storage area that can be utilized independently or in conjunction with the larger hall.

We would like to thank our Contactor Beachland Developments Ltd and his team for the fantastic job with the refurbishment.

The works will ensure that Locking Parish Hall remains a cornerstone of the community, offering an open and welcoming place where residents and visitors can connect and participate in a vibrant array of activities.

The new facility will be known as the Nurse Thomas Suite and is available to hire at the hourly rate of £8.50 per hour.

Renaming of Locking Parish Hall's new room competition - Results!

The Parish Council received five entries for the renaming competition and at the Full Council Meeting on 5 September each name was considered and voting was as follows:

Therefore, it was **AGREED** that the new meeting room would be formally named **The Nurse Thomas Suite**

Well done to **Locking Senior Club** for putting forward the winning entry, we look forward to inviting you to the official opening of the room once the renovation works have been completed.

Why the Nurse Thomas Suite?

Nurse Margaret Thomas arrived in Banwell around 1927, bringing with her the dedication and skills of a newly qualified nurse from Anglesey. Originally stepping into a temporary role due to the ill health of the existing nurse, she soon found herself in a position that extended for over three decades.

Throughout her remarkable tenure, Nurse Thomas provided care not only in Banwell but also in the surrounding areas of Locking, Christon, and St George's. It was in these villages that she delivered hundreds of babies, becoming a cherished figure in the memories of many families.

As she tended to the needs of the communities, she bore witness to the remarkable growth of Banwell and Locking, which tripled in size during her time there

Her commitment to patient care was characterised by her travels on a bicycle for her daily visits, however, as her responsibilities expanded, Nurse Thomas upgraded her mode of transport to a Morris Minor car, reflecting the increasing demands of her role as the area grew.

Nurse Margaret Thomas passed away in 1966. The love and respect the villagers had for her prompted a meeting to discuss a fitting tribute, leading to the establishment of the Nurse Thomas Fund, which successfully raised £685 and ten shillings. The funds were subsequently utilised to set up clinic rooms in both Banwell and Locking.



Community Orchard

The Community Orchard is continuing to thrive, we had some beautiful apple blossom and some trees did bear fruit.

We are once again in the process of applying for funding from the Tree Council's Branching Out Fund to hopefully obtain funding to plant more fruit trees (Pear, Cherry, Plum, Mulberry and Chestnut) next February/March.

Tiny Forest: Speaking of planting tree's the Parish Council, working with North Somerset Council have submitted an application for funding to plant a Tiny Forest on land at the playing field. If the bid is successful, we will be looking for volunteers to help us and Earthwatch plant approx. 600 assorted trees in a 200sq.m space. Contact the Clerk if you would like to volunteer.

What is a Tiny Forest?

Tiny Forests are planted using the Miyawaki method with a view to create a well-established woodland area (200sq.m) that enhances biodiversity and provides good tree canopy cover quickly.

They also serve as a great way of involving the local community and schools in caring for and learning about nature. For further information go to https://edu.earthwatch.org.uk/tinyforest

Old Banwell Road Car park:

Resurfacing and lining of the car park took place during August and September. We thank our contractor N Bartlett Ltd for a good job well done.

We are currently in negotiations with a company to install EV charge points. I'm sure you will agree the car park is now an asset to the Playing Field providing free parking during school term time and we would like to thank Locking Primary School for arranging the gates to be open and closed during these times

We understand that residents would like the gates to be open all year round but unfortunately, we do not have any volunteers who would be willing to open and close the gates 7 day per week or the funds to employ another member of staff

The Parish Council are investigating the costs of installing electric gates and will consider this a project for the next financial year.

The installation of electric gates would allow the car park to be used throughout the year as well as offering security from illegal encampments.

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET

We had reports of an increase in dog poo at the allotments and playing field - It is important to remember to immediately clean up after your pet.

Besides being unsightly and smelly, animal waste can be hazardous to the health of our children who play in the community and other pets.

One of the most common forms of disease transmission between dogs is through faecal matter.

Take along a bag with you to pick up waste and then dispose of it in one of the dog waste bins provided.

Speaking of dog waste, this can be disposed of in your general waste bin please don't dispose of carrier bags full of dog waste in the parish dog bins, this is extremely heavy to lift out and as you can imagine very unpleasant for our Parish Orderly who empties these bins.

By taking a few simple steps to clean up after your pet you can contribute not only to the beautification of our community, but also towards the elimination of one of the most irritating nuisances.

ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Theft of Plants from tubs/gardens, St Augustine's Church and theft of Allotment produce.

Over the summer we again had a spate of plant thefts across our community from the wooden planters in Locking Village just days after volunteers dedicated countless hours to beautifying the village with colourful bedding plants, the majority disappeared in a brazen act of theft.

The ongoing thefts at St Augustine's Churchyard have further compounded this disappointment, particularly affecting families who visit the graves of their loved ones. The loss of flowers and plants in this sacred space is not just a material loss but also an emotional blow for those seeking solace in nature's beauty. The local police have acknowledged the seriousness of these thefts and are making it a priority to address the situation.

It's believed that the perpetrator is likely an adult residing in the vicinity, which adds a layer of disappointment to the situation. As a community, it's essential to stay alert and proactive, reporting any suspicious activities and capturing evidence when safe to do so.

It is disheartening to think that the perpetrator of these thefts may be an adult living locally, someone who is well aware of the effort and dedication that volunteers invest in making Locking a picturesque place.

Locking Village: Arson.

Reports indicate that instances of intentional fires have affected various areas within the community, including hedging, trees, and a fence belonging to a private property.

The Local Fire Service was quick to respond to these acts of vandalism, highlighting the alarming nature of the events and the potential risks posed to both property and public safety.

The Police were notified immediately and have since conducted inquiries into the matter. We believe that they have engaged in discussions with an adult in connection to the incidents

The Parish Council express their gratitude towards the community members who played a pivotal role in reporting these incidents. Their actions not only facilitated a quicker response but also reinforced a sense of collective responsibility.

Defibrillator & Bleed Kit

The defibrillator (also known as an Automated External Defibrillator or AED) and Bleed Kit to stop blood loss are located in secure boxes by the entrance to Locking Parish Hall BS24 8AR What3Words: retrieves, Packets, host.

The AED and Bleed Kit is available for use 24/7 to anyone in the vicinity who requires it,

meaning that more people benefit from the presence of this device and lives could be saved.

When you dial 999 the Ambulance Call Handler will ask a series of questions and should your patient require it, they will

identify the nearest available defibrillator or bleed kit to you, and give you access details





Marmalade Christmas Cheer

The Marmalade Trust is now open to new referrals for the Marmalade Christmas Cheer 2024 project.

They will be offering Christmas Day lunch time events in local pubs and restaurants for those who are able to self-mobilise and are keen to socialise with others on Christmas Day.

They will also be offering a festive doorstep social visit for those whose physical or mental health mean they



are unable to attend an event but would still like to share some conversation with a friendly volunteer on Christmas Day.

Christmas Cheer 2024 – eligbility: They can accept people who:

- Would otherwise be alone on Christmas Day (no family, friends or neighbours to see on Christmas Day) and feel lonely most or all of the time.
- Live in Bristol, South Gloucestershire or North Somerset.
- Live on their own, in their own home, rented or owned, (i.e. not nursing home or sheltered housing where meals are provided in the company of others).
- For meal events able to self-mobilise (this can be wheelchair users who can self-transfer), get in & out of transport and be happy seated at a table with other members and volunteers and look after their own personnal care.
- For doorstep visits able to come to their door, receive a gift and have a chat.
 (N.B. Our volunteers are not able to enter properties).
- Be comfortable making and remembering the arrangements with the volunteers.
- Are not experiencing a mental health crisis or drug/alchohol abuse.

They are unable to take forward referras which do not include the referrers' contact details. This information is vital in situations where we cannot get hold of someone or if they are unable to take them forward for the option selected. Alternatively people can self refer by calling the Marmalade Trust on 07566 244788.

Why Make a Lasting Power of Attorney?

Should you have an accident or illness, many believe that your spouse or relatives will automatically be able to make decisions for you, yet this is not the case.

Registering a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) allows you to choose people you trust to act for you if you become unable to do so yourself in the future. There are two types of LPA and it is advisable to have both.

Property and Financial Affairs

This LPA covers the paying of bills, mortgage, treatment or care. As well as access to bank accounts, pensions & investments and the buying, selling, maintaining of property and allow your attorneys to communicate with banks and professionals such as financial advisers and accountants.

Health and Welfare

This LPA covers where you live, day-today care, medical treatment and therapies as well as expressing your personal wishes concerning end of life decisions. An LPA for health and welfare allows your attorneys to speak with medical and social care professionals on your behalf which can determine the care and treatment you receive.

What happens if I don't make a Lasting Power of Attorney?

If you don't have an LPA in place, and you can no longer make decisions yourself, your family will need to obtain permission to act for you from the Court of Protection. This process can be very stressful, expensive and can take months. In the meantime, your family is effectively stuck, unable to assist you.

Many believe that if they are married or have joint accounts that they don't need an LPA. Bank accounts can be frozen and being married does not give you the power to decide for your spouse/civil partner if he/she is incapacitated.

Making LPAs gives you peace of mind that those you trust have practical powers to assist you without the stress of applying to the Court of Protection.
