VIEW FROM THE CHAIR...

Chairman's Report - Autumn Edition of 'Looking at Locking'.

I welcome you all to our new look 'Autumn Edition of Looking at Locking Newsletter'. I believe that the refreshed look is informative and hopefully is of benefit to all within the Parish. It is only right that I should thank the editorial team comprising of Ms Michele Callaghan and The Clerk for producing this newsletter which to my view is a means of providing relevant information and advice to residents in our growing community. I would also recommend that Parishioners visit our website at www.lockingparishcouncil.co.uk for further information on meetings and activities.

It is clear to Council that Locking Parklands will continue to grow with further housing and infrastructures being developed almost daily. The new Locking Parklands Secondary School and Health Centre are clearly needed within our growing community as they benefit everyone for a number of reasons. What we as a Parish Council have to ensure is that our current assets and infrastructure is capable of supporting these new developments.

Your Parish Council is concerned about the state of the footpath in the 'Spinney' which many residents of Locking Parish will recall, with the bridge over the A371, was a major link to Royal Air Force Locking. With the removal of that bridge and with the proposed construction of the new Secondary School and Health Centre, we believe that there is a real need for a safe and proper route between Locking Parklands and existing businesses and facilities in Locking village. Residents on both sides of the A371 must have a safe well-lit route for pedestrians to travel in the parish. We as a Parish Council are seeking to engage with developers and North Somerset Council to address this important issue.

Secondly, we have also recognised that during recent difficult times that mental health issues are becoming more evident, in response to these issues, we have installed exercise equipment and will soon install a 'trimtrail' and park benches for all to use at the Old Banwell Road (OBR) Playing Fields. These works were identified as part of our long-term Plan for the

Playing Field which is being progressed and completed whenever funding allows. As a major project for the next financial year Council are looking to upgrade the 'Park and Stride Carpark' at the OBR Playing Fields to make it more user friendly. We are currently exploring options for drainage and surfacing along with other funding streams. We intend to hold an open day for consultation and an opportunity for parishioners to meet Councillors.

Council continues to engage with Stakeholders to address matters which can affect our community. I am a firm believer that working in partnership is better for all concerned in our fast-growing community.

I am also led to understand that unfortunately a number of well-known parishioners and ex Councillors have recently passed away. Our thoughts and condolences are with the families and friends of Peter Carr, Brian Carter, Tony Coles, Alex Robertson and Dave Wallace - they will be missed. I am sad to report that Ms Jo Roberts resigned from Council in July this year. Jo amongst her many contributions played a pivotal role in coordinating Locking Parish Council's volunteer response during and after Covid lockdown. I wish to thank Jo on behalf of Locking Parish Council and Parishioners for her valued contributions which I am sure many in our community will remember and are grateful for her help during those difficult times. The Clerk has in the interim taken over responsibility for the co-ordination of volunteers should any assistance be required in the future. Locking Parish Council has currently 5 Councillor vacancies, for further details of what the role entails please see page 11 in this newsletter or contact The Clerk on 01934 820786 for further information if you feel you are able to volunteer, help and contribute to our growing community.

I take pride and a sense of achievement in seeing changes that have resulted from the decisions that Council has made especially when the community benefits.

Cllr Mike Tremlett -

I live in Weston-Super-Mare near the sea front but work at the Hive Business Centre close to the Parish boundary. I have been a Councillor now for just over a year. I enjoy being able to share my experience and knowledge with other Councillors (particularly from a Planning perspective) and having lived in Locking Village previously, I have an affinity with the Parish and want to give something back to the Community.

Cllr Wendy Ashdown – (Chair – Hall, Park & Green)

I reside on Locking Parklands and have done so for the past 7 years. I have been a Councillor for 5 years now and enjoy being a Councillor because it gives me the opportunity to give something to the Community. I have recently taken over the responsibility of the Hall, Park and Green as Chair. We have completed many improvements including a mini makeover to the Parish Hall and new solar lighting along the path across the park. Also, 4x new picnic tables and benches have been installed for the community to enjoy.

Cllr Carl Prosser -

I live in Locking Village and have been a Councillor for 2 years.

I attended many council meetings prior to becoming a Councillor, whilst sitting in on the meetings I felt that I may be able to offer an approach that complimented the rest of the Council. I have my own business which I started when I was 17 years old and now employ up to 50 people. I felt that the skills I have learnt during this time would assist with situations that may arise within the Council.

We as a team have carried out a number of projects since I have joined, solar lighting in the park and by the school path, exercise equipment in the park, makeover of the hall, planters within the Parish, sapling planting at the Old Banwell playing fields to name a handful that you may or may not have noticed.

We also have some larger projects that are ever evolving such as the Old Banwell Road playing field area, and the ongoing work to try to reduced flooding within the Parish as well as trying to keep an eye on what developers are trying to do within our Parish.

Cllr Elfan Ap Rees -

I first joined the Parish Council in circa 1971 but moved out of the village in 1976 and resigned. I next Joined Woodspring District Council in 1977, representing part of Weston but subsequently moved back to Locking in 1984 and became a District Councillor here covering Locking, Hutton and Bleadon Parishes.

I retained that position surviving nine consecutive re-elections and eventually becoming Deputy Leader of North Somerset Council, returning to my roots you might say as an Independent.

Cllr Les Mason –

I have been a serving Councillor for 15 years and I represent Oaktree Park. My main aim has always been to make sure that residents of Oaktree Park feel a part of Locking Parish, looking after their interests, making sure they have a voice at local level which I will continue to do so in my role as a Parish Councillor.

Cllr Pete Lacey -

I've been a member of Locking Parish Council for approx. 12 years. Having brought up a family in Locking, and having the benefits of its many groups and organisations over the years, I felt that retirement presented me with an opportunity to stand for election as a Parish Councillor. There were a number of reasons back then, the main ones being to support those good things about our community, whilst seeking to improve the aspects that needed improvement.

Massive development was about to commence on the Northern and Western borders of the Parish, so there was also a need to make sure that those living here already had a `voice` in decisions that would change our circumstances and environment. This we have done, and continue to do. As a Parish Councillor, do you have any effect? That`s the question that so many ask. Yes, we do — we have changed things around the Parish for the better, and we certainly make ourselves known when chasing issues that concern parishioners.

Is it worth the effort? It certainly is ... Sometimes the processes that the law demands we use are frustrating and time consuming, and effects are rarely seen instantly. But we use due process to good effect for example on compliance issues – but to do so we have made sure that we are compliant ourselves. We consistently monitor where small physical improvements could be made around the Parish, and we are attempting to improve our longer-term capacity in project delivery by longer term financial planning. I could go on! – but not today.

We currently have vacancies!

Cllr Anthony Hetherington -

I have been a Councillor for the Parish since September 2019. I have lived in Locking Village since 2018 but have a long association with the area as my parents were residents for many years.

I am a retired police officer and I joined the council in order to continue to assist and play an active part in the community. I serve on the main Council and the Estates Committee. I am currently on a leave of absence.

HALL, PARK & GREEN COMMITTEE

Parish Hall – It's good to see the hall being busy again – we have some welcome new activities in the hall which you can find out more later in the newsletter. The hall is available for hire for all sorts of activities, you will find our list of charges on page 15 please contact the Clerk or Michele if you want to book the hall or have a look around before you book. We continue to keep the Hall and Park in tip top condition recently replacing the old dishwasher, we are also repairing the stage ceiling which was damaged by a squirrel infestation, and replacing the old rear doors at the back of the Hall – funding for these works is from our maintenance budget. The Parish Hall car park is a very dark unwelcoming facility as the winter draws in, the Committee decided to install another light at the front of the hall to help with this – we want all our hall users to feel safe while using the car park.

The Park – The Park equipment had its annual inspection by RoSPA in June, the report was very good and showed that our maintenance routine is paying off. We have received some lovely feedback since the picnic tables

have been installed - The Co-op Garage kindly donated another picnic table making a total of 4. It's good to see them so well used throughout the day. Please remember the Park is a Dog Free Zone and we hope that anyone using the Park will respect that and leave their dogs outside the Park or at home. The Parish Orderly continues to keep the Park clear of rubbish and the occasional dog fouling which unfortunately is still occurring from time to time.



The Green – This is a small area of green opposite the Coronation Garden – tis surrounded by hedging with a small access gate and seating area – lovely space if you want to 'get away from it all' to sit, read or picnic.

Allotments

We have recently installed outside gym equipment at the playing field, and are pleased to see it being well used, later this month will see the Trim Trail being installed along with picnic tables, we will be providing litter bins soon but, in the meantime, could you please take your litter home with you. The Parish Community Orchard will see apple, pear, plum trees being planted over the next few months, they will join the abundance of blackberry and sloe berry bushes already present – free picking for all!

The Parish Council will be turning its attention to the car park facilities and

new footpath for the next financial year (subject to funding) – watch this space further details.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The neighbourhood plan is being progressed to provide the Parishioners of Locking a say in how development is considered moving forwards within the Parish. The final say will sit with the residents of the Parish by way of referendum before any document is adopted. The process started in the Spring of 2021 during lockdown with an initial meeting with interested parties via zoom. The plan needs to be in line with the upcoming emerging North Somerset Local Plan so when the initial version of that document is available, the plan can then be progressed. Progress has been slow due to lockdown constraints but once the first draft of the North Somerset Local Plan is available, matters can progress further. Thank you so far to the attendees of the initial meeting as well as volunteers that have come forward.

LOCKING PARISH COUNCIL SMALL GRANT SCHEME

Locking Parish Council's annual budget includes a sum of money for grant awards.

A grant is any payment made by the Council to an organisation for a specific purpose that will benefit the Parish, or residents of the Parish, and which is not directly controlled or administered by the Council.

Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972 requires that such grants must be "in the interests of or will directly benefit the area or its inhabitants, or of part of it, or of some of it" and "the direct benefit should be commensurate with expenditure."

The law also limits the total amount of expenditure the Council may incur on such payments.

Any organisation wishing to apply for grant funding must fill in a **grant application form** and submit it to the Clerk.

The Council awards grants, at its discretion, to organisations which can demonstrate a clear need for financial support to achieve an objective which will benefit the Parish by:

- Providing a service
- Enhancing the quality of life
- Improving recreation and/or sports

- Improving the environment
- Promoting the Locking Parish in a positive way

Locking Parish Council will not normally make grants to organisations outside of the Parish unless there are direct benefits to the Parish, or its residents. Applications should be made for 'one-off grants' that will not result in any recurring expenditure for the Parish Council.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Grant requests must be on a completed Locking Parish Council **Grant Application Form**.
- 2. All requests must include the necessary supporting documentation listed on the application form.
- 3. Completed application forms and documentation should be sent to the Parish Clerk (email or post).
- 4. Applications will be considered at a Full Parish Council Meeting, and will only be awarded by resolution of the Full Council.
- 5. Grant awards are subject to the availability of sufficient funds. Should you require any further information please contact the Clerk. **2021/22 The Parish Council** are pleased to announce that Small Grant

MAKE A CHANGE BECOME A PARISH COUNCILLOR

Why become a PARISH COUNCILLOR

Locking Parish Council delivers and facilitate projects and services that make a positive

difference to the community. The Parish Council aims are to support and improve the quality of life for the parish of Locking.

As a councillor you can become a voice for your community and affect real change. It helps if you're a "people person" who enjoys talking to other residents but, more importantly, you need to have the concerns and best interests of the parish as a whole at heart.

As a Parish Councillor you help make decisions as part of a democratic team on how to use the resources and powers of the council for the benefit of the local community.

Councillors are community leaders who care about the local residents they represent, to bring about the best outcomes for all parts of the community.

How much time will it take?

On average, a few hours a week, but you may be able to contribute more or less than this, but all councillors are expected to do something. You must usually be able to attend the monthly Council meeting. Council Meetings take place on the first Thursday of each month and second Thursday for Committee meeting both at 7.30pm at the Village Hall.

There is also an annual meeting which all parishioners are invited to attend. All meetings are advertised on the council notice boards and on the website.

You can talk and listen to members of the parish at any time and it can help if you have shared interests and activities with some of the diverse range of people in the community.

Councillors are expected to attend training, which may be 1 to 3 times a year. In your first few months, we aim to provide training for new councillors which is provided by Avon Local Council Association. This helps you discover how a council works, what you can and can't do as a council and councillor and how best to contribute to your local area.

What knowledge or skills do I need?

Parish Councils benefit from a diverse range of people and we welcome interest from all areas of the community – different ages, backgrounds, experiences and abilities.

Good communication skills, being a good listener, problem solving, analytical thinking and being a team player are all welcome attributes.

The Clerk is available to advise on procedures, policies and legal matters so you do not need this knowledge to get started.

All Councillors are required to abide by the Code of Conduct and by law you must register financial, business and other interests in the Parish.

How can I become a councillor?

There are two routes – election and co-option:

Normal elections are held every 4 years, the last election for Locking Parish was held in 2019. Electors can identify potential councillors and nominate candidates for election. To continue as councillors all existing councillors stand for re-election. People are encouraged to vote and elect councillors to represent their interests.

Outside of an election, if there is a vacancy on the council and an election is not required, you can be co-opted as a new member. This involves the council members voting to co-opt you as a new member during one of the council meetings.

Locking Parish Council currently have 5 vacancies and are actively encouraging new members to be co-opted.

What are the requirements?

Anyone can stand as a candidate provided, they meet the qualification requirements. You should be:

- aged over 18;
- a British, Commonwealth Citizen or Citizen of an EU country;
- a registered elector

and have:

- been Resident for 12 months prior to the day of election/co-option
 either in the parish or within 3 miles of the boundary, or;
- occupied land or premises for 12 months as owner or tenant –
 either in the parish or within 3 miles of the boundary, or;
- had a principal place of work either in the parish or within 3 miles of the boundary.

Am I excluded from standing?

You cannot become a Councillor if:

- have been declared bankrupt within the last five years if you have not repaid your debts.
- have been convicted of a criminal offence and sentenced to not less than three months imprisonment (whether suspended or not) without the option of a fine within the last five years.
- you have been disqualified under any legislation relating to corrupt or illegal practices.

Parish Councils are the most local part of our democratic system and are closest to the public. Why don't you stand for your local parish council and see what difference you can make to your local community?

The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now.

Come along to a parish council meeting, or speak to one of our councillors and find out what they think of the job.



OAKTREE PARK MEMORIAL GARDEN

Locking Parish Council this year supported the installation of a 'Garden of Remembrance' for residents at Oaktree Park by contributing a number of wooden planters and plants.

Councillor Les Mason and his wife Anne were responsible for assisting in the installation of the planters, they with other residents ensured that the blessing conducted by Reverend Anne Wilkins was memorable – it was a moving day for all.



SPEEDWATCH – LOCKING VILLAGE

Speed watch sessions have been taking place in Locking Village since April 2021. The locations used are agreed and designated by the Local Community Speed Watch Team with the full cooperation and support of Avon and Somerset Constabulary as certain criteria have to be adhered to. Community Speed watch supports the police by monitoring the speed of vehicles through communities using approved equipment and reporting those that exceed the posted limit to the police.

Community Speed watch does not enforce the law but those identified as exceeding the speed limit can expect to receive an advisory letter from the police.

Our presence has been welcomed by many Locking residents who feel that speeding through the village is something they feel very strongly about.


