Chairman's Report - Spring Edition of 'Looking at Locking'.

Welcome to the 'Spring Edition of Looking at Locking', I hope you find it informative, positive and good reading. My thanks to our editorial team (Dawn and Michele) who have worked hard to produce this first edition in 2022. As we continue to grow as a Parish, I urge Parishioners to visit our website at www.lockingpc.co.uk for further information on meetings and proposed activities within Locking Parish.

It would appear from current news reports (at the time of writing) that Covid 19 restrictions may shortly be relaxed and that we will be able to return to some type of normality. As a Parish Council we have continued to meet, despite difficulties in order to discharge our Parish duties, the day-to-day business has also been successfully conducted by our clerk and her assistant.

There have been some interesting developments which may have an impact on residents living within Locking Village. North Somerset Council have recently produced a draft 'Local Plan for 2023 - 2038'. This draft plan seeks to address the requirement to build large numbers of new housing within North Somerset, it also includes proposals for such and its policies. Whilst this local plan is now subject to consultation, I would advocate that it is important that Parishioners partake in any consultation so that their views and representations can be made. There is a proposal within the plan to build a number of units on land at Elm Grove Nursery, Locking. As a Parish Council we will continue to monitor and engage with North Somerset Council to make our position clear, further information can be found at <https://n-somerset.moderngov.co.uk/documents> Parishioners are encouraged to contact us if they have concerns or wish to discuss this local plan.

Following public representation at our February meeting by 'Oaktree Park residents', Councillors unanimously agreed to fully support them in their efforts to re-establish a bus service from that site to the wider community following the withdrawal of the community bus. Our Ward Councillors

have been engaged and are aware of our concerns regarding isolation and potential welfare issues.

I am pleased to state that we are working in partnership with others to deliver the 'Big Picnic Lunch' to commemorate the 'Queen's Platinum Jubilee' on 3 June 2022. The next meeting of the group is to be held at 7 pm on Thursday 8 March 2022, further details can be found within this edition.

I can also report that we are in the process of engaging with contractors in order to further our main project for 2022/23 which is the resurfacing and drainage of the Old Banwell Road Car Park.

The state of the Public Right of Way (PROW) through the 'Spinney' remains a major concern to Council, it is understood that the new Doctor's Surgery will be hopefully completed at the end of the year. This important link between the village and Locking Parklands requires upgrading urgently to make it accessible and safe for all users.

The Annual Parish Assembly is to be held at 6.30 pm on Thursday 28 April 2022 at Locking Parish Hall, this is an opportunity for members of the public to meet Councillors and to raise issues or concerns should they wish to do so.

Finally, it is with sadness that I have to report that Tony Hetherington has stood down as a Parish Councillor. On behalf of Council, I would like to thank Tony for his contribution and time and wish him well for the future. There are a number of vacancies on the Parish Council, if you feel that you can make a difference in our community and have time to give, please contact the Clerk for further information.

How is your council tax spent?

We maintain the equipment, undergo regular inspections along with grass cutting, fences, tree and attenuation pond maintenance, also the booking of the pitches</p>	<p>Grenville Avenue Park</p> <p>The Council are responsible for all the play equipment, picnic tables, benches and gym equipment. We inspect, manage and maintain the play and gym equipment, picnic tables, benches, safety surfacing, fencing, grass cutting and tree maintenance.</p> 
<p> Locking Parish Hall</p> <p>The Parish Council are responsible for the bookings and maintenance of the hall and car park.</p>	<p> Staff</p> <p>The Council employ 3 members of staff: The Clerk, Administrative Support Assistant and Parish Orderly</p>
<p>Allotments</p> <p>The Council are responsible for allocation of plots and maintenance for the allotment site at the rear of Byron Road, Locking. Currently there is a waiting list for a plot.</p> 	<p>Trees/hedges and flower tubs</p> <p>The Council have responsibility for trees and hedges at The Green, the Coronation Garden and the flower planters at Locking Village, some at Flowerdown Park and Oaktree Park.</p> 



Litter/Dog Bins

The Council employ a Parish Orderly, who collects litter and empties dog bins in the areas we are responsible for, which is currently all litter and dog bins situated within Locking Village.



Street Lights

The Council are currently responsible for 22 street lights (we pay the electricity) and 5 solar street lights in Locking village. The remaining lights come under the responsibility of North Somerset Council.

Councillors

The Council employ a Clerk, and one area of responsibility is to ensure councillors operate within the parameters of the law. Your Councillors are all voluntary – only District and County Councillors receive an allowance.



Grass Cutting

The council have a 3-year contract for areas we are responsible for including the park and Old Banwell Road Playing Field. Our Parish Orderly cuts the small pockets of land and some of the Public Rights of Way within the Parish and North Somerset Council do the rest.



The Precept is the element of your Council Tax that is paid to Locking Parish Council.

Every year, the Parish Council draws up a budget and calculates how much money it needs for the next Financial Year. This is then submitted to North Somerset Council (NSC). NSC co-ordinates the other demands from the Police and themselves and come up with the rate to be paid from 1st April that year.

For the financial year 2022/23, the Parish Council has set a Precept of £113,000.00.



Other members of the public can attend and speak but they cannot vote.



PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET

It doesn't take much to remember that we have pets in our community. In fact, if you don't watch your step, you are liable to step in one such reminder!!

Besides being unsightly and smelly, animal waste can be hazardous to the health of our children who play in the community and other pets. One of the most common forms of disease transmission between dogs is through faecal matter. When walking your dog in our community, remember that it should be leashed. **Also, it is important to remember to immediately clean up after your pet.** Take along a bag with you to pick up waste with and then dispose of in one of the bins provided for the community within Locking Parish. By taking a few simple steps to clean up after your pet you can contribute not only to the beautification of our community, but also towards the elimination of one of the most irritating nuisances within our community. You may have noticed that some of our community have been saving their doggie bags from their gardens and are disposing of them in our community bins. [SPEEDWATCH – LOCKING VILLAGE](#)

Speed watch sessions have been taking place in Locking Village since April 2021. The locations used are agreed and designated by the Local Community Speed Watch Team with the full cooperation and support of Avon and Somerset Constabulary as certain criteria have to be adhered to. Community Speed watch supports the police by monitoring the speed of vehicles through communities using approved equipment and reporting those that exceed the posted limit to the police.

Community Speed watch does not enforce the law but those identified as exceeding the speed limit can expect to receive an advisory letter from the police.
