VIEW FROM THE CHAIR...

Welcome to the Autumn/Winter Edition of Looking @ Locking. It was with great sadness that we learnt on 8 September 2022 of the passing of our beloved Queen. She was our longest serving Monarch and for many of us the only Monarch we have ever known. Locking Parish Council responded to the sad news by producing a Book of Condolence, designating an area for floral tributes and ensuring that the appropriate announcements were made. The outpouring of affection, sadness and respect for the Queen was clearly evident in our community, she will be missed but will not be forgotten.

At the moment the Queen died, the throne passed immediately and without ceremony to the heir, Charles, the former Prince of Wales. On Saturday 10 September 2022, King Charles III was officially proclaimed King.

Locking Parish Council is very aware of the effects of the increase in the cost of living and energy price rises on everyone in our community. We will continue to monitor the situation with our partners and stakeholders in order to ensure that we can respond to those who perhaps find themselves in need of help.

We have also continued to ensure that day to day business is conducted efficiently and effectively with the Parish Office open throughout difficult times. Locking Parish Council did not meet during August; however, the office was open for Parishioners and users of the Hall.

Our focus remains on upgrading the Old Banwell Road Playing Field Carpark and I am pleased to state that a 'Planning Application for the upgrade of the carpark' will be submitted to North Somerset Council shortly.

Council is also pressing North Somerset Council and Contractors to assist in the upgrade of the public path known as the 'Spinney'.

The upgrade of this important pedestrian link between the Locking Village and Locking Parklands becomes more imperative with the completion of the construction of the new Doctors surgery and new Secondary School on Locking Parklands. I am pleased to advise that our Ward Councillors are also in support of an upgrade of this important community link.

We are also preparing with interested parties a 'Neighbourhood Plan' which will eventually lead to public consultation. If anyone is interested in being part of this important strand of work, please contact Cllr Mike Tremlett. A Working Group has already started looking at this issue.

At this time there are currently 12 Councillors on the Parish Council and 3 vacancies. If you have time to give and want to be involved in your community, please contact the Clerk for information on how to be a Locking Parish Councillor.

Save the 126 Bus – Locking Parish Council has already lobbied North Somerset Council, Mr John Penrose MP and Mr Doug Claringbold at First Bus and have urged residents to do the same. At the time of writing this report we have only received a response from Mr John Penrose MP, the response was not particularly helpful in finding a solution to save the bus service. Locking Parish Council will continue to try and find a workable compromise to ensure that there is a public transport link for our community.

As Chairman I would like to thank our Clerk Dawn and Admin Assistant Michele for the production of this informative Parish Newsletter.

RoSPA conducted their annual inspection of all play equipment in June and we are pleased to report that very minor issues were found and have been dealt with over the summer. We will be installing another wheelchair inclusive picnic table in the very near future.

In Honour of her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee the Parish Council have commissioned 5 bespoke benches from a local Locking Craftsman Mr R Barton, The Proper Pallet Emporium.

The benches will be made of recycled wood and will be sited across the Parish in the next few weeks.

A big thank you to Locking Coach House (Mark & Lorna) for the donation of one of the benches and a special thank you to local resident from Fairacre Close for his donation towards the cost of a bench.

Given the recent sad passing of Her Majesty, we do hope that when the benches are completed and located around the Parish, residents will not only see and use the benches as a reminder of the Platinum Jubilee Picnic, but to also reflect on how the Queen has been a part of all of our lives for so long. We do sincerely hope that they will be a welcome reminder and that they will be well used.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVOUR

Community Orchard at Old Banwell Road Playing Field – it
has been so sad to see the criminal damage done to 6 of
the fruit trees that had been planted. The trees had been
snapped in half or pulled out completely, their metal
stakes thrown around the playing field. The Parish
Council are committed to this worthwhile community
project and will replace the fruit trees in due course.

- A set of Goal Posts at the playing field have been pulled out Fruit Tree
 of their metal socket causing the metal 'elbows' that support the nets to buckle.
 It's believed that one of the youths responsible damaged his mobile phone
 screen while carrying out the damage.
- Storage container at Old Banwell Road Playing Field there has been an issue with children climbing onto the top of the container – Anti-climb paint has been applied with appropriate notices displayed.
- Graffiti to the green wooden shelter in the park Crude drawings and wording to the inside of the shelter, this shelter is a well-used feature in the park by adults and young children our Parish Orderly has now repainted the shelter.
- Speaking of the wooden shelter we have recently replaced part of the wooden roof, less than 2 days later it was very upsetting to receive a report of attempted criminal damage by 1 girl aged 14/15 years attempting to kick the panels off while 2 boys aged the same watched.
 - As a consequence, to the ongoing Anti-Social Behaviour and Criminal Damage the Parish Council are looking to install more CCTV cameras at both these locations.
- The bench seat on the Public Right of Way near to the Allotments We have received reports of youths gathering causing a nuisance and possible drug taking.
 We ask that if you witness any incidents to report this to Police on 101 (if safe to do so) and to the Parish Council.

Halloween can be fun especially for kids, but we also recognise this time of year can be stressful for people who are elderly, vulnerable or live alone. We want everyone to enjoy a safe and happy Halloween.

If your concerned about staying safe:

- Pick up a No Tricks or Treats poster from the Parish Hall to display in your window
- Always put the door chain on and look out of the window or spy hole to see who's there before answering.
- Only open the door if you feel safe to do so its fine not to answer the door if you don't want to.
- If you're really worried, invite a friend or relative around and spend the evening together.

Safety advice for trick or treaters:

- Always go trick or treating with an adult.
- Only go to houses where you or your friends know the residents.
- Don't knock on doors where there is a sign saying 'no trick or treat here'.
- Don't knock on the doors of strangers (or look out for signs that trick or treaters are welcome, such as Halloween decorations).
- Stay in areas that are lit with streetlights and take a torch with you just in case.
- Stay with your friends don't split into smaller groups unless an adult goes with you.
- Throwing eggs and flour at houses causes criminal damage. You could be arrested.
- Don't talk to strangers on the street and never enter any house, just stay on the doorstep.
- Although Halloween is supposed to be spooky, be considerate to those who don't take part and be careful not to frighten vulnerable people.
- Remember road safety, always look carefully before crossing the road and be visible.

COMMUNITY DEFIBRILLATOR

Locking Parish Council has teamed up with Heartsafe and Great Western Air Ambulance Charity to replace the old defib and cabinet (both out of warranty) with a brand new Heartsine 500P AED and cabinet which comes with 10-year warranties and online and/or inperson bystander CPR training, a stainless-steel heated cabinet, public liability insurance, help registering our defibrillator with the ambulance trust, and assistance supporting with the device's ongoing maintenance.

The defibrillator (also known as an Automated External Defibrillator or AED) is located in a secure box by the entrance to Locking Parish Hall BS24 8AR What3Words: retrieves. Packets, host.

The AED is available for use 24/7 to anyone in the vicinity who requires it, meaning that more people benefit from the presence of this device and lives could be saved.

Sudden cardiac arrest can happen at any time, to anyone, of any age, in any location.

When a person collapses in sudden cardiac arrest, minutes count as the patient is not breathing and their heart has stopped beating.

Performing immediate CPR can keep a person's brain and heart alive until definitive care arrives but using an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) can give the patient the best possible chance to survive!

When you dial 999 the Ambulance Call Handler will ask a series of questions and should your patient require it, they will identify the nearest available defibrillator to you, and give you access details.

Locking Parish Council have funded the new equipment and is pleased to have this vital lifesaving piece of equipment at the Parish Hall to serve the community should they need it.
