

VIEW FROM THE CHAIR . . .



Welcome to this Spring edition of Looking @ Locking.

It is with pleasure, that I am able to say, thank you, to all those who have contributed to this New Year's edition of Looking @ Locking. I hope you will find this edition informative and helpful in understanding what your Parish Council and others do for you.

Firstly, I must sadly report that Mr Noel Walter, a well-known Locking Parishioner, Parish Councillor and also the ALCA Treasurer for many years passed away on 18th February 2023. Noel will be missed but will be remembered for his generous and substantial local community work, our thoughts as a Council are with his family at this difficult time.

On behalf of my fellow Councillors, we welcome Cllr Ian Hilder and Cllr Paul Schofield and look forward to working with both.

This new year has been also extremely challenging for a number of reasons, predominantly the increased cost of fuel, food and other essential items which has impacted on us all.

What have we, your Parish Council been doing to help Parishioners in our community?

We have introduced the Parish Pantry and the Warm Space which is being held in our Parish Hall. With our partners and stakeholders in the community, we have been able to raise funds that have enabled us to identify where food, essential items and winter warm packs should be distributed to those during these difficult times.

Businesses and individuals who have kindly supported our community initiatives need know that we acknowledge and appreciate their contributions that really do help families in our Parish to weather this particular storm.

On behalf of Locking Parish Council, a huge 'thank you is in order'.

We as a Parish Council will continue to monitor and work with partners in order to provide help where it is most needed. In the last edition of Looking @ Locking a number of Parish Council objectives were outlined.

At the time of writing, North Somerset Council have approved our planning application to upgrade the Car Park at the Old Banwell Road Playing Fields (OBR).

Tenders have now been sought and received for initial drainage works which are now being scrutinised. It is hoped that any remedial works at the OBR Car Park will be conducted in the School holidays in order to minimise disruption to children, residents and users of the OBR Car Park.

The 'Spinney' public path continues to be a serious contentious issue as it is clearly to Council's collective mind 'not fit for purpose' yet it is described as being an important link to the new Health Centre/Surgery and ever-growing Secondary School. Our Ward Councillors continue to support our view that the Spinney needs to be upgraded to make it a safe and proper path for all residents and they continue to highlight the urgent need to address this public path. Locking Parish Council continues to engage with contractors who are involved in the construction of the School and Doctors Surgery in order to highlight the state of the public path and to try and secure assistance in remedying its poor condition.

Our Neighbourhood Plan under the guidance of Councillor Mike Tremlett and others continues to be developed, during a recent meeting attendees were able to identify ways to ensure that new developments will meet the needs of our community and be carbon friendly, safe and built in a way that meets the demands of our growing population whilst bearing in mind important flood and environmental risks. Locking Parish Council continues to make representations to North Somerset Council over the demise of the 126 Bus Service. We have solicited the assistance of our Ward Councillors and explored other avenues of transportation with other parties. It is currently understood that North Somerset Council will introduce a demand bus service which might alleviate our concerns over the lack of transport to and from Locking Village. Seeing is believing!

May 2023 is a very important month, for Councils because it is at this time that elections are held to elect Councillors to positions within the County, Town and Parish. There are 15 positions available for Parish Councillors to serve on Locking Parish Council, an applicant must meet the criteria as outlined by North Somerset Council and submit the nomination documentation which can be found on North Somerset Council website by the date stipulated.

'Nomination Papers for Parish Councillors' must be submitted to North

Somerset Council.

- Start of Nominations is from 10 am on Tuesday 21 March 2023.
- Close of Nominations is at 4 pm 4 April 2023.

HRH Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee Commemorative Benches and Trees

The Parish Council commissioned 5 bespoke benches for our communities to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee from Mr Rob Barton, The Proper Pallet Emporium. Mr Barton is a local hobbyist woodworker who lives in Locking Village.

The benches each feature a Union Jack and a commemorative plaque; all the benches were made using recycled wood, same design but at the same time each one unique depending on what recycled wood was available.

Watch out for a bench appearing in your neighbourhood soon.

We thank local Locking resident Mr Horner who generously donated £20 towards the cost of the benches and The Coach House Locking who also generously donated a bench which has been installed in the park at Locking Village.

The Parish Council also purchased 5 sapling trees with the help of Mr Chris Clarke from Locking Village who advised on the best species for each of our communities. Mr Clarke has been kind enough to offer to plant the trees when the resident representatives/directors have decided on a location.

North Somerset Council: New Demand Responsive Transport

Demand Responsive Transport (DRT) is set to be introduced in North Somerset enabling many people who are currently without a local service to get back on the bus.

The new 'demand responsive transport' (DRT) services will go where they're needed and run without a set timetable, typically using smaller vehicles than fixed route bus services. North Somerset Council and the West of England Combined Authority have been working together on contracts for these new services which are due to start running from Monday 3 April this year.

Demand responsive transport will bring public transport to areas of North Somerset which have traditionally struggled to sustain timetabled services due to low passenger demand, or that may have been inaccessible to larger vehicles. The areas to benefit from DRT zones are still being considered and will be adjusted over time to cater for demand, but the broad areas where they are expected to begin to operate are:

- Clevedon/Portishead/Yatton
- Weston-super-Mare (Locking, Hutton, Worlebury and surrounding hamlets)
- the south east of North Somerset, including Bristol Airport
- the south west/south east of North Somerset, including Axbridge in Somerset.

Initially there will be 16 buses in North Somerset running from 7am until 7pm, Monday to Saturday. Passengers will be able to book their journeys by phone or through a mobile app.

The buses will be available for short trips or to connect to the wider public transport network.

Pricing will be in line with fares for local buses and Diamond Travel concessionary passes will be accepted, along with the West of England multi-operator ticketing for seamless onward travel.

North Somerset Council will share more details over the coming weeks ahead of the services launching in April.

Staff

The Council employ 3 members of staff: The Clerk, Administrative Support Assistant and Parish Orderly

Allotments

The Council are responsible allocation of plots and maintenance for the allotment site at the rear of Byron Road, Locking. Currently there is a waiting list for a plot.



Trees/hedges and flower tubs

The Council have responsibility for trees and hedges at The Green and the along the Coronation Garden and the flower planters at Locking Village, some at Flowerdown Park and Oaktree Park.



Litter/Dog Bins

The Council employ a Parish Orderly, who collects litter and empties dog bins in the areas we are responsible for, which is currently all litter and dog bins situated within Locking Village.



Street Lights

The Council are currently responsible for 22 street lights (we pay the electricity) and 5 solar street lights in Locking

village.

The remaining lights come under the responsibility of North Somerset Council.

Councillors

The Council employ a Clerk, and one area of responsibility is to ensure councillors operate within the parameters of the law. Your Councillors are all voluntary - only District and County Councillors receive an allowance.

Grass Cutting

The council have a 3-year contract for areas we are responsible for including the park and Old Banwell Road Playing Field, Our Parish Orderly cuts the small pockets of land and some of the Public Rights of Way within the parish and North Somerset Council do the rest.

The Precept is the element of your Council Tax that is paid to Locking Parish Council. Every year, the Parish Council draws up a budget and calculates how much money it needs for the next Financial Year. This is then submitted to North Somerset Council (NSC). NSC coordinates the other demands from the Police and themselves and come up with the rate to be paid from 1st April that year. For 2023-2024 the Parish Council have requested a 3% increase on Band D properties.

Stand for election to be a Parish Councillor on Thursday 4 May 2023

All of Locking's fifteen Parish Councillor places will be available

If you are passionate about Locking, want to make a long lasting change, have ideas for the Council, or have concerns about a specific issue and want to do something about it, then please stand to be a Parish Councillor.

Being a Councillor is all about giving back to the community by bringing your energy, enthusiasm and ideas to make a difference to local people and how local matters are dealt with. You would support residents with issues, represent the views of local people to get Locking the right services and help shape plans for the Parish.

We need people from all backgrounds and experiences to represent the community. It's a rewarding experience which will involve you to work with a small team of people on a range of projects and initiatives. Training is also available and courses are run by the Avon Local Council Association.

Standing for election

To stand in the election, you will need to complete a nomination form by 4 April 2023, which is available by emailing clerk@lockingparishcouncil.co.uk or calling 01934 820786, these can also be downloaded from North Somerset Council's website

The form should also be completed by two other people who live in the Parish to propose and second your nomination. It is then returned to the Returning Officer at North Somerset Council, Town Hall WSM – closing date is 4th April 2023 4pm.

If more nominations are received than there are places available (for example, more than 15 nominations), an election would be carried out in the Parish. If the same or fewer nominations are received, Councillors would automatically be elected without a ballot taking place. If there are still vacancies after the election, the Parish Council would try to fill them as soon as possible after the election.

Parish Councillors stand for a term of four years, but sometimes vacancies do occur during this period.

Make sure Locking gets the very best by standing for election.

Voter ID Resource - May 2023

Voter ID

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Which forms of ID can I use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

For more information on which forms of photo ID will be accepted, visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

If you don't have an accepted form photo ID

If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a **Voter Authority Certificate**. You can apply for this at <u>voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk</u>.

Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to the electoral services team at your local council.






Figure 3 Flowerdon Park

PARKS:

We would like to thank Locking Parish Council for the lovely bench in celebrations of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We are sure it will get a lot of use and residents will be able to sit and enjoy the open space.

We were also successful in securing a match fund grant from the North Somerset Council for new play equipment, with this installed into all three park areas within Flowerdown Park during January.

Feedback from families has been very positive, with children of all ages enjoying getting outside to try out the new equipment.

The parks and play areas within Flowerdown Park are not owned or maintained by North Somerset Council or Locking Parish Council. They are private parks, with the maintenance and upkeep funded by those with a home on the estate.

SURFACE WATER:



Recycling - Open letter from a local Resident

A little reminder!

Whole walking my dog around the Parish, I have noticed that not everyone is recycling clean items in their recycling boxes.

All items should be rinsed clean before they are included for recycling, especially ready meal trays,

yogurt pots, jam/peanut butter jars and tins.

On most packaging now, we can find symbols telling us how to recycle. The **thin film** on things like trays of fruit or trays of ham are not recyclable, so these go in your **rubbish bin**. Milk bottle tops and pop bottle tops can be recycled on the bottles. Plastic bags from vegetables, crisp packets, toilet rolls etc., can be saved and taken to your supermarket and recycled, there is usually a large metal cage at the front of the store just for these.

Please, can we all try a harder, it just takes seconds to read the packaging and recycle correctly. Thank you.

RECYCLING YOUR RUBBISH

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T WASH MY RECYCLING

In short, you run the risk of ruining everything, and diverting the whole recycling load – not just yours – to landfill. 'Items that are placed in recycling bins are collected and taken to MRF (a material recovery facility) where they are sorted and processed'.



Food residue is a form of contamination because food residue left on containers cannot be reliably processed. Contamination is created when the wrong materials are put into the system (e.g. nappies in the recycling bin) or when the right materials are prepared in the wrong way (e.g. food left in containers).

If contamination levels are too high when a recycling load arrives at the facility, it might have to be rejected. If this is the case, then the whole load is sent to be burnt for energy or to landfill which is not ideal.


